Note 2: A person who intentionally makes a false statement in a statutory declaration is guilty of an offence, the punishment for which is imprisonment for a term of 4 years – see section 11 of Statutory Declaration Act 1959

Note 3: Individuals who refuse to provide a current police certificate or cannot provide a satisfactory police check will be precluded from employment/continued employment or volunteering with Five Good Friends.

Notes 4: A statutory declaration under the Statutory Declarations Act 1959 may be made before a range of persons including a Justice of the Peace, Legal Practitioner, Medical Practitioner, Nurse, Pharmacist and Postal Manager. Refer to the next page for the complete list.

## A statutory declaration under the Statutory Declarations Act 1959 may be made before—
